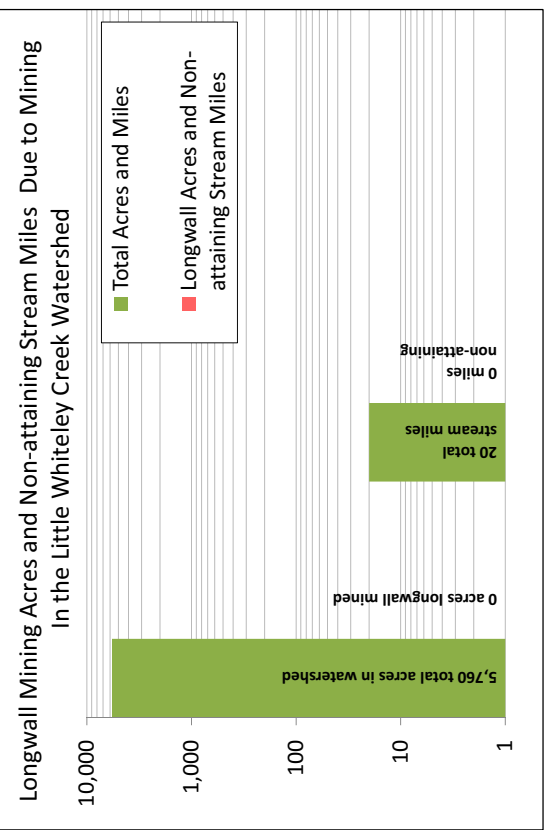


# Little Whiteley Creek Watershed

Little Whiteley Creek Watershed, is completely within Greene County, PA. It is approximately 9 sq. miles / 5,760 acres. Little Whiteley Creek Watershed spans over 3 municipalities. They are: Cumberland, Greene, and Monongahela Townships. There are approximately 20 stream miles in the watershed – all are designated as being in attainment. Pennsylvania State Routes 21 and 88 intersect in the watershed. Little Whiteley Creek flows east and empties into the Monongahela River. Approximately 353 acres of State Game Lands # 223 are in the headwater / western portion of the watershed.
